<u>Science</u> This half term we will explore and understand the various habitats located around the world. Children get to explore habitats such as the ocean, the Arctic, Antarctic and rainforest. Further to this, children get the chance to think about how animals have adapted in order to thrive.

<u>PSHE</u>—As part of our school branches we are focusing on 'Inquisitive Fox' The children will be learning about getting involved, being enthusiastic and imaginative.



Topic—
