# Maths—Statistics

The children revisit how to use bar charts, pictograms and tables to interpret and present discrete data. They will decide which scale will be the most appropriate when drawing their own bar charts.

## Shape

Children will identify whether an angle is greater than or less than a right angle in shapes and turns, by measuring, comparing and reasoning in practical contexts.

# Science - States of Matter

This unit will ensure the children understand the basics behind states of matter, including how a liquid can turn into a solid or a gas, and how the molecules change. The unit also puts this theory into practice by looking at how evaporation and condensation work, and how it is presented through the water cycle.

# **English**

We will be looking at a book called The Anglo-Saxon boy. This is an action-packed Anglo-Saxon tale of one boy's journey to the Battle of Hastings in 1066.

This English unit links closely with our current topic and it will give the children an opportunity to write for a range of purposes. The children will write a speech about why they should be a member of Harold's household and then write a newspaper article about the battle of Hastings.

PE—Cricket and Athletics

This cricket unit will teach the children the skills and techniques needed in order to take part in Kwik Cricket games and matches. The children will learn the fundamental skills of both batting and bowling, developing their ability to hit and strike a ball towards different areas of a cricket ground, as well as learning the technique for bowling overarm from a standing position.

# Computing - Repetition in Games

Children will design, write, and debug programs that accomplish specific goals, including controlling or simulating physical systems and solving problems by decomposing them into smaller parts.
