The topic this term is 'What is it that defines me?'. In this topic, pupils learn how to understand their own sense of identity. We will be looking at our own self-image and the impact of social media and social influencers.

We will then be looking at famous designers and designing and making our own clothing product.

PSHE—

Our PSHE is based on self image and identity. This will be taught through our Experience topic.

Maths

We are going to be using the scheme 'White Rose' This scheme helps to develop children's reasoning skills. This term we are going to focus on fractions, decimals and percentages, measurement and geometry.

It is very important that the children know all of their times tables, squared and cubed numbers, so please practise these at home.

Computing– In computing, pupils will learn about web page creation. They will be looking at how a website is made and creating their own web pages using a certain programme.

PE

In PE lessons, the children are going to be doing hockey. We ask that full P.E kit is kept in school and all jewellery is removed for each session. If for any reason your child cannot take part in a lesson, they must have a note to explain why. Remember that keeping active is important for health and wellbeing.

English writing, reading and SPAG.

This term we will be focusing on our writing. We are starting off by writing a narrative. We will also write newspapers, information texts and much more.

Reading will take place daily and will focus on developing the skills that will be assessed at the end of Yr 6.

Spellings, punctuation and grammar will focus on different spelling patterns, word classes, types of sentence structures, tenses and punctuation.

Science

This term we will be learning about Evolution and Inheritance. We will be looking at how adaptations help animals survive, what fossils can tell us, how genetics work, why animals can look different to their parents and the work of Mary Anning. We will be doing lots of practical activities including creating our own fossils and dissecting the DNA of a banana.
