be introducing the children to the school value branches.



magic, emotions and the seaside are the themes' we will use to stimulate the children's learning. The indoor and outdoor provision in our setting will support your child's development of their communication and language, English and maths learning, physical development, expressive arts and design skills, PSED areas and their understanding of the world.

English, spelling and phonics

For the first few weeks we will consolidate your child's phase I phonological awareness



(understanding of initial sounds, oral blending and oral segmenting skills). We will then start to teach letters from phase 2. Each of your child's phonics sessions will involve learning a sound, hearing, reading and writing that sound in words and applying their learning in a sentence. They will do a phonics session daily. They will also be involved in lots of other daily additional reading and writing sessions.

Reading There is an information sheet in the reading journal. Each Friday we will give your child a

banded book and a sharing book. Please read the banded book with your child for at least 20 minutes over the week making comments in their journal. The sharing book can be used to develop language and discussion.

Rainbour words. Rainbour word sessions will take place throughout the week. We will put lists of these in their reading journal for your child to practice reading and writing across the half term. We will assess their reading and writing of these words half-termly. (On some occasions this may be more frequent.)
